**Dear Parents and Carers** 

We are going to start sending homework for spelling and maths home, but we want to reduce the amount of paper and resources we send home.

To help with this we will be using Google Classrooms and "google docs" for this. This is a suite of programmes recommended by the DfE to help support children's learning during the pandemic. We also hope to use it once life returns to normal!

In order to do this we will need your consent to create a Google Suite for Education account for your child. This will be a safe, secure site within the school domain.

Once you have given your permission we will send further information on how to access the work and return completed work etc.

Once we have become familiar with the system, we want to start using it for more work in school and at home.

It will also be the main way we will set work if a class has to go into isolation. It is very important that you either sign up or let us know if you have difficulties accessing a computer. This is because the Government does expect all parents to support their children's learning and we want to be able to support you.

Please do not hesitate to contact school if you have any questions and we will try our best to answer them!!

Attached to the electronic version of this letter is more information on Google for Education and how it works. Please take time to read this and then sign and return the Google Classroom User Agreement.

# Google Classroom User Agreement

The purpose of our Google Classroom is to provide a safe and secure place to receive and share learning, and a place to connect with school staff and classmates. In Google Classroom, school staff can assign work to the students digitally, without paper. Google Classroom is accessible from any digital service with internet access and a web browser. Parents/carers can login and view the assignments that have been set, whether their child has completed them and submitted them, and any feedback that they may have received.

Parents/Carers and pupils are expected to read and adhere to the points outlined below. You may need to read the agreement to your child and explain what it means.

# **Responsibility**

- Using your G Suite account, check Google Classroom every day to view new assignments.
- Complete your learning online by either completing it on a digital device, using Google apps, or by doing it in your book/on paper and submitting a photo of it (or other file, such as video or sound clip, if required).
- Complete the learning provided to the best of your ability.
- Remember to submit learning by clicking "Turn in" on Google Classroom.
- Check and respond to any feedback you may have received from school staff.

#### <u>Safety</u>

- Do not share personal information such as e-mail, home address or phone number.
- Only login using your own username/login and password.
- During "learning time", you will be expected to use Google Classroom to access, complete and submit learning. You should not use this time to access other content on the internet unless it is for the learning that is being done.
- Ask permission of a parent/carer when accessing content on different websites/apps.
- When submitting images, sound clips or video, make sure that these are appropriate for the learning task. Check with your parent/carer if you are unsure.

#### Respect

- Your G Suite account (and Google Classroom) is to be used for learning and not for social purposes.
- Be polite, friendly, and encouraging in any communication with school staff and other pupils.
- Send polite and responsible messages and think carefully about how online messages can affect others.

#### **Comments**

(Comments by pupils may be enabled for pupils to comment or provide feedback on any learning tasks they have been set.)

- Make sure your comments are about the learning and that they make sense. Be sure to check and edit comments if necessary.
- Be aware that any comments deleted by pupils are still visible to school staff.
- Avoid using text language like "u" for "you", etc.
- Do not use strings of exclamation or question marks: one "!" or "?" will do.
- Try to correct your spelling mistakes.
- Use capital letters in the correct places: proper nouns (names of people and places, the beginning of a sentence, and for the pronoun I. Please don't use ALL capitals.
- Use punctuation correctly; full stop at the end of a sentence, space after a full stop and comma, etc.

Please also refer to the Summerfields E-Safety Policy which includes our Computer Acceptable Use Pupil Agreement when accessing Google Classroom and other content on the internet. (This can be found on the school's website at <u>www.summerfieldsprimary.co.uk</u>.)

# G Suite for Education Notice to Parents and Guardians

This notice describes the personal information we provide to Google for these accounts and how Google collects, uses, and discloses personal information from students in connection with these accounts.

Using their G Suite for Education accounts, students may access and use the following "Core Services" offered by Google (described at <u>https://workspace.google.com/terms/user\_features.html</u>):

- Google+
- Calendar
- Chrome Sync
- Classroom
- Cloud Search
- Contacts
- Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms
- Drive
- Groups
- Google Hangouts, Google Chat, Google Meet, Google Talk

Children may also have access to Additional Services from Google such as You Tube or Google Maps.

Google provides information about the information it collects, as well as how it uses and discloses the information it collects from G Suite for Education accounts in its G Suite for Education Privacy Notice. You can read that notice online

# What personal information does Google collect?

When creating a student account, Summerfields may provide Google with certain personal information about the student, including, for example, a name, email address, and password. Google may also collect personal information directly from students, such as telephone number for account recovery or a profile photo added to the G Suite for Education account.

When a student uses Google services, Google also collects information based on the use of those services. This includes:

- device information, such as the hardware model, operating system version, unique device identifiers, and mobile network information including phone number;
- log information, including details of how a user used Google services, device event information, and the user's Internet protocol (IP) address;
- location information, as determined by various technologies including IP address, GPS, and other sensors;
- unique application numbers, such as application version number; and
- cookies or similar technologies which are used to collect and store information about a browser or device, such as preferred language and other settings.

## How does Google use this information?

In G Suite for Education Core Services, Google uses student personal information to provide, maintain, and protect the services. Google does not serve ads in the Core Services or use personal information collected in the Core Services for advertising purposes.

In Google Additional Services, Google uses the information collected from all Additional Services to provide, maintain, protect and improve them, to develop new ones, and to protect Google and its users. Google may also use this information to offer tailored content, such as more relevant search results. Google may combine personal information from one service with information, including personal information, from other Google services.

# Does Google use student personal information for users in K-12 schools to target advertising?

No. For G Suite for Education users in primary and secondary (K-12) schools, Google does not use any user personal information (or any information associated with an G Suite for Education Account) to target ads, whether in Core Services or in other Additional Services accessed while using an G Suite for Education account.

# Can my child share information with others using the G Suite for Education account?

We may allow students to access Google services such as Google Docs and Sites, which include features where users can share information with others or publicly. When users share information publicly, it may be indexable by search engines, including Google.

# Will Google disclose my child's personal information?

Google will not share personal information with companies, organizations and individuals outside of Google unless one of the following circumstances applies:

- With parental or guardian consent. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google when it has parents' consent (for users below the age of consent), which may be obtained through G Suite for Education schools.
- With [insert name of school/district]. G Suite for Education accounts, because they are school-managed accounts, give administrators access to information stored in them.
- For external processing. Google may provide personal information to affiliates or other trusted businesses or persons to process it for Google, based on Google's instructions and in compliance with the G Suite for Education privacy notice and any other appropriate confidentiality and security measures.
- For legal reasons. Google will share personal information with companies, organizations or individuals outside of Google if it has a good-faith belief that access, use, preservation or disclosure of the information is reasonably necessary to:
- meet any applicable law, regulation, legal process or enforceable governmental request.
- enforce applicable Terms of Service, including investigation of potential violations.
- detect, prevent, or otherwise address fraud, security or technical issues.
- protect against harm to the rights, property or safety of Google, Google users or the public as required or permitted by law.

Google also shares non-personal information -- such as trends about the use of its services -- publicly and with its partners.

# What choices do I have as a parent or guardian?

First, you can consent to the collection and use of your child's information by Google. If you don't provide your consent, we will not create a G Suite for Education account for your child, and Google will not collect or use your child's information as described in this notice.

If you consent to your child's use of G Suite for Education, you can access or request deletion of your child's G Suite for Education account by contacting the school office. If you wish to stop any further collection or use of your child's information, you can request that we use the service controls available to limit your child's access to features or services, or delete your child's account entirely. You and your child can also visit <u>https://myaccount.google.com</u> while signed in to the G Suite for Education account to view and manage the personal information and settings of the account.
